

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

The information below will be updated periodically to reflect new funding opportunities, including grants and scholarships available through the Oranim International School. We encourage you to consider these and other resources.

- [Israel Institute](#) – This scholarship provides provide \$1,200 in funding to undergraduate and graduate students in good standing at American universities who are enrolled in at least one course offered by a college or university in Israel. It is ideal for students participating in study abroad or summer study programs September. Deadline: June 18, 2024.
- [Go Overseas Study Abroad Scholarship](#) – This scholarship is open to all current or aspiring study abroad students and is awarded based on the creativity and analytical thinking displayed through a combination of writing, photos, and videos. The application deadline generally falls around mid-September.
- [Benjamin A Gilman Scholarship Program](#) – This scholarship provides awards for U.S. undergraduate students who are receiving Federal Pell Grant funding at a two-year or four-year college or university to participate in study abroad programs worldwide. The Gilman Scholarship Program accepts applications two times per year. Ideally, students should begin their application one full semester before their study abroad program is scheduled to begin.
- [Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society Scholarship](#) – Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grants are designed to help support undergraduates as they seek knowledge and experience in their academic fields by studying abroad. Fifty \$1,000 grants are awarded each year.
- [The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation](#) – This private, independent foundation, established by Jack Kent Cooke, was founded to help young people of exceptional promise reach their full potential through education. Contact them via [e-mail](#) for details.
- [Ministry of Foreign Affairs](#) – The Government of Israel offers scholarships to foreign students, as agreed in the Cultural Agreements between Israel and qualified countries (a full list of countries can be viewed on the site). Only citizens of these countries may apply. For more information contact the ministry via [e-mail](#) for details.
- [Students Supporting Israel](#) – Designed for students who demonstrate a strong interest in Israel-related issues, have campus leadership experience, and who have at least one more year left before graduation and after returning from the program in Israel. Scholarship is \$1000.
- [Western Union Foundation Global Scholarship](#) – The Western Union Scholars program helps fund high-potential, in-need students; see under “Global Scholarships.” If you

believe you meet the eligibility requirements contact WUFoundation@iie.org. Scholarship is up to \$2500.

- Amy Adina Schulman Memorial Fund (<https://amyadinaschulmanfund.org/>) provides grants to young adults from North America who contribute their time and expertise in Israel and across the world making an impact as they work towards: building a just and egalitarian society; enhancing understanding among people; advancing non-violence; promoting environmental concerns; or working with individuals who are emotionally, physically, educationally, or economically disadvantaged. Scholarships are variable.
- Fund for Education Abroad (FEA) (<https://fundforeducationabroad.org/scholarships/>) provides scholarships and ongoing support to students who are underrepresented among the US study abroad population including minority, community college, and first-generation college students. Scholarship is up to \$5000. For more information, contact fea@fundforeducationabroad.org.
