

Celebrating Commitment to Peace: ALF Israeli Network Member, Parents Circle - Families Forum Awarded Prestigious Pax Christi International Peace Award

Comprising over 700 Israeli-Palestinian families affected by conflict, [PCFF](#) focuses on reconciliation as a key to lasting peace. They strongly believe reconciliation is crucial for lasting peace and employ education, public gatherings, and media outreach to promote this message.

Established in 1988, the Pax Christi International Peace Award, funded by the Cardinal Bernardus Alfrink Peace Fund, honors those advocating peace, justice, and nonviolence worldwide. The Pax Christi International Peace Award award ceremony is slated for 2024 in the Holy Land. A December 10th, 2023, webinar introduced PCFF as this year's awardee on Human Rights Day.

PCFF collaborates with [Combatants for Peace](#), organizing the annual Israeli-Palestinian Memorial Day Ceremony, fostering remembrance and hope amidst shared pain. Despite restrictions on their educational programs in Israeli schools, PCFF remains committed to fostering peace by nurturing constructive communication skills among children and teenagers.

Pax Christi International lauds PCFF's impactful efforts amid ongoing violence and brutality in the Holy Land. This award signifies support for their advocacy for dialogue and nonviolent solutions.

Martha Inés Romero, Secretary General of Pax Christi International, emphasizes acknowledging strength over revenge and hate, fostering hope for a dignified future.
